


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In November, over 80 colleagues joined Dr Lucy Pollock in the Knowledge & Library service webinar on Caring for Older People. Lucy read medicine at Cambridge University and St Bartholomew's Hospital and trained in general and geriatric medicine in London before taking up a consultant post in Taunton in 2001. Her best selling book 'The Book About Getting Older' was published in 2021. Sandi Toksvig said that it's 'The most important book about the second half of your life you'll ever read' and Prof Andrew Goddard, President of the Royal College of Physicians, recommended it to 'all medical students and doctors of any age.' It was wonderful to see so many colleagues and community partners in the session from a huge range of roles and specialities, including, consultants, students, physios, paramedics, GPs, nurses, HCSWs, OTs and senior leaders, frailty specialists and so many more.

Our survey results showed that attendees of the event were extremely satisfied with it and found it extremely helpful in providing new learning and knowledge. There was so much for everyone to reflect on, but the main takeaways from the event were useful tips on how to avoid overtreatment in elderly patients, the importance of putting the patient first in their individual care plans, and the need for open and honest conversations with patients and their families about their care.

Attendees also appreciated Lucy's engaging and charismatic style of speaking and the use of real-life examples and anecdotes in the presentation and reported that they received all of the information they needed before the event. There were no suggestions for improvements, and overall, the attendees would highly recommend the event to a colleague with a number of respondents suggestions for the future saying 'can we have more sessions like this please!'

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



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
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Positively purple : build an inclusive world where people with disabilities can flourish by Kate Nash
