What is an ultrasound scan?

Ultrasound scanning is one of the quickest and safest ways we have of examining the body and uses sound waves. The reflections or echoes of sound from inside the body are used to build up a picture of the body on a computer screen.

What does it involve?

You will be taken into a scan room and asked to uncover the area to be examined. The sonographer will apply gel to your skin. They will systematically examine the area requested by your doctor. This requires a very high level of concentration so we ask that only parents of young patients or essential carers accompany the patient into the scan room. The scan findings are analysed after the scan and a report is sent to the requesting doctor.

What preparations are needed?

Please do not have anything to eat or drink for **5 hours before** your appointment. You may take any required tablets with a small amount of water. If you take tablets or have injections for diabetes, please telephone the Diabetic Liaison Nurse for advice on 01271 322726, Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm.

What about my general health?

There are no medical conditions that prevent us performing an ultrasound. If you have a medical condition that makes the preparation for the scan difficult for you, please contact your GP for advice.

Are there any risks?

Ultrasound is one of the safest ways we have of examining the body. It does not use X–rays or require injections of dye. Ultrasound has not been shown to have any harmful side effects in medical use.

Results

Once the ultrasound scan is done, the results will be analysed by the sonographer and sent back to the referring clinician – usually your GP or hospital doctor. The sonographer will not be able to tell you the results directly.
