Further to your Freedom of Information Act request, please find the Trust's response(s) below:

Please be aware that the Royal Devon University Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust (Royal Devon) has existed since 1st April 2022 following the integration of the Northern Devon Healthcare NHS Trust (known as Northern Services) and the Royal Devon and Exeter NHS Foundation Trust (known as Eastern Services).

I would like to research the number of out-of-area (OOA) placements as well as the number of people with a delayed transfer of care (DTOC) in an in-patient setting for the following condition:

1. Acquired Brain Injuries (ABI) condition – Patients in a level-3 neuro-rehab facility in-patient bed.

Please note: Neurorehabilitation patients are described as having Category A, B, C or D rehabilitation needs. The Level 1, 2a, 2b and 3 refers to the inpatient unit, not the type of patient. Mardon Neurorehabilitation Unit is a Level 2b neurorehabilitation in patient unit. So, the FOI does not relate to any patients who have come through Mardon House.

- Out of area patients on our Trust level 3 neuro rehab unit with ABI= 6
- Delayed transfers of care for all patients on the unit (not just out of area)= 7
