

Pressure continues despite industrial action finishing

Our staff responded incredibly to the challenges we faced over the holiday season and through the last round of industrial action. They rose to the challenge, respected each other and worked incredibly hard throughout the entire period to ensure our patients were cared for and safe. We are very proud of them.

But we need you to help us help you. We are still incredibly busy, with rising numbers of COVID-19, flu, other respiratory diseases, and norovirus (diarrhoea or vomiting) infections in our hospitals.



Please do your bit by choosing the right service for your needs:

- If you have an urgent medical problem that isn't an emergency and aren't sure what to do, contact 111 first by phone or online – they will provide medical advice and direct you to the best care for your needs.
- Please don't visit a loved one in hospital if you are showing any symptoms of COVID-19 or flu or any other infection (such as diarrhoea and vomiting).
- When visiting, some of our wards may have visiting restrictions limiting the number of visitors and length of visit. This helps us stop the spread of certain illnesses. You will be informed of this when you get to the ward.
- If you have an outpatient appointment and have symptoms of an infection, please call the number at the top of your letter to postpone your appointment.
- If you have an appointment at one of our hospitals, please attend unless you hear from us.
- If you have a life-threatening emergency, our ED remains open 24 hours a day.


Trust to host new £3m HealthTech Research Centre and new Research Delivery Network

We are delighted to share two developments that will be happening in 2024, as part of our work to be a research-focused leader in the South West.

In partnership with the University of Exeter, we will open a new **HealthTech Research Centre** in the South West from April 2024. This will be one of 14 centres across the UK. It has been made possible by £3m of funding from the National Institute of Health and Care Research (NIHR).

These centres will support the development of medical devices, diagnostics and digital technologies. These technologies will enable people to better monitor their health, diagnose ill health sooner and improve management of conditions including cancer, dementia, cardiovascular and respiratory disease.

Launching in October 2024, we will be the host organisation for the **South West Peninsula's Regional Research Delivery Network** (RRDN). This will be one of 12 new networks set up across the country by the National Institute for Health and Care Research.

The new network will work across the health and care system and collaborate with patients, staff, and other key stakeholders to support all stages of the research journey, from initiation to delivery. This will benefit people receiving care now and, in the future, support the NHS and care services, and generate benefits for the UK economy.

Acute Hospital at Home service celebrates first birthday

Our Acute Hospital at Home (AHAH) service based at North Devon District Hospital is celebrating its first birthday. The service is a safe and efficient alternative to receiving care as an inpatient on an acute hospital ward.

This time last year, AHAH began to support our patients in northern Devon, and over the last twelve months the team have cared for 370 patients with various different conditions, helping them avoid a stay in hospital.

An inspiring physiotherapist at the Royal Devon was recently honoured at the Parkinson's UK Excellence Network Awards.

Nominated by several patients and families, Suzanne Seymour, neuro-specialist physiotherapist, won the People's Choice award in November and was recognised for her work setting up Power UP, a group for people recently diagnosed with Parkinson's in North Devon.

Power UP is a fun and informative course which runs over 11 weeks. It includes an hour of exercise and 45 minutes of education about the symptoms of Parkinson's and physical activity.

The families who have benefitted from the service said: "Power UP has been transformational and inspiring. Suzanne has given hope to, and improved the fitness levels of, countless people with Parkinson's."


