

Breast care after your needle biopsy

You attended the Breast Care Unit today for a needle biopsy of your breast. A dressing was placed over the needle site.

Instructions for you to follow after having a breast biopsy

- 1. The biopsy area should be kept dry and the dressing over the wound should be left in place for at least 24 hours. It can then be removed. You can replace the dressing with a small plaster if needed until the wound has healed.
- 2. You may experience some discomfort in your breast after the local anaesthetic wears off. This will settle over the next day or so. If you need to, take a simple 'pain killer' such as paracetamol. **Please do not take aspirin** as this could cause further bleeding. Wearing a supportive non-wired bra for the first 24 hours after your biopsy may provide additional comfort and support.
- 3. You may go back to work after your biopsy, but we advise you not to do any strenuous exercise or heavy lifting for 24 hours.
- 4. Some bruising at the biopsy site is to be expected and will clear over the next week. Occasionally, a small lump may appear due to the bruising. This will also settle eventually.
- 5. If you notice swelling, pain, bleeding or a new fever, please contact your GP or call NHS 111.
- 6. A doctor or nurse will discuss your results with you when they become available. This is usually within 7-14 days.
