You have been seen today in the orthoptic clinic.

Your child will need follow up orthoptic appointments which may continue on a regular basis over the next few years.

We often see children in the orthoptic clinic up to the age of approximately 8 years old, depending upon their eye condition.

It is vital that your child is brought to **all** their appointments in order to monitor their visual development and to start or change any treatment that may be required.

The orthoptic department sees many children and each appointment slot is of great value.

On average 37 orthoptic appointments are missed per month, which equates to 2.5 whole days of clinics or approx. 450 appointments per year. This means other children are waiting longer than necessary for their orthoptic appointments.

We understand that it is not always possible to make the date or time offered, but it is very important that you contact us immediately if you cannot make your appointment so that we can offer it to another child on the waiting list.

We can be contacted on 01271 322469, and if our admin team cannot take your call there is an answerphone available for you to leave a message. Please include details of your telephone contact number, your child's name, date of birth and the appointment date and time should you need to change it.

Please remember to update us with any change to your address or telephone contact details whilst your child is under our care.

Please note, it is Trust policy for the department to inform the safeguarding team if children are repeatedly not brought to their appointments.
